




Feed and Seed Handmade Levels


#### Photographs With And Without Memories




# A FEW WORDS AT THE END OF THE JOURNAL

After we moved to North Carolina, I found the Carpenter Feed Store and I harvested that inspiration by creating the <u>Carpenter Portfolio</u>.


Of course, we act surprised when the returning tide curtails our artistic effort because we weren't done making that best photograph of the day. Handmade

We attended the annual celebration of North Carolina history and arts at Hart Square near HIckory, North Carolina. As I walked by a window, I saw a potter at work making jugs. I thought it would be fun to make a series of photographs showing the process.

The time between the first and last image in this series was almost exactly eight minutes.

Levels

Fort Worden State Park in Washington is an absolute wonderful place to go scrambling about, up and down stairs, ladders, hidden passages and paths through the woods. Usually there are groups of middle school students on a field trip doing just that, blowing off all the energy held in check during the bus ride to the Fort. This is a great example of the experience of the photograph and the experience of the place being completely opposite.
